Key interventions:

- Qatar pledged \$100 million for the reconstruction of Ukraine.
- King Salman Center for Relief and Humanitarian Aid provided 1,332 food baskets in Sudan.
- The pharmacy unit was inaugurated at the Wad Madani Hospital in Sudan, donated by Qatar Red Crescent.
- Kuwait Red Crescent supported Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh by building the emergency department at Cox's Bazar Sadar Hospital.
- Our Jerusalem Endowment Foundation renovated 17 houses in occupied Jerusalem.
- International Mercy Foundation executed the Qurbani project in 29 countries benefiting 96,000 beneficiaries.
- Qatar Charity provided 326 new shelters for Rohingya Muslims in Bangladesh.
- King Salman Center for Relief and Humanitarian Aid provided relief assistance to 1,200 families affected by the earthquake in Idlib.
- The World Assembly of Muslim Youth established a development and educational center in Kazakhstan.
- The Islamic Charity Body executed the Qurbani project in 25 countries benefiting 11,000 beneficiaries.
- Turkish Religious Foundation executed the Qurbani project in Mauritania, benefiting 675,000 people.
- Turkish organizations distributed sacrificial meat to 100,000 needy families in Pakistan.

Most urgent interventions achieved

- The State of Qatar provided cash assistance of \$100 to 100,000 poor families.
- Conducting 50 cochlear implant operations in Hamad Hospital, with a donation from the Qatar Fund for Development.
- Approval of 27,000 new names within the Qatari grant lists
- The opening of the Italian Tower after reconstruction as a result of its destruction in the 2014 war, funded by the Italian government.
